Primary PE Sports Grant Awarded			£19,000
Summary of Sports Grant Spend 2025-26			
Item/ Project	Cost	Objective	Reason for allocation
Slough School Sport Network	£6,000	To support staff training and provide additional sporting opportunities through hiring coaches for sports like cricket and dance.	Last year, staff participated in over 20 hours of CPD sessions, improving confidence and skill in delivering PE lessons, in line with the DfE's PE and Sport Premium objectives. More than 150 students engaged in extracurricular sports, with Year 5/6 boys' football team achieving a 90% win rate in local tournaments and securing top positions in three competitions. Student participation in structured physical activities increased by 25%, promoting teamwork and resilience as highlighted by the Youth Sport Trust. We are allocating funding to joining the Network again, to ensure that training and support, involvement in fixtures and events continue to be at the forefront of what we offer to staff and children.
PE Hub	£600	To support PE teaching by staff through a skill-based programme.	100% of teaching staff have completed PE Hub training, reporting a 35% increase in confidence to deliver PE lessons independently. Last year, over 90% of students demonstrated improved physical literacy, with 70% showing progress in coordination and agility based on internal assessments. The programme's tracking tools help to identify students needing additional support, aligning with the DfE's focus on inclusive PE. These outcomes directly contribute to long-term improvements in activity levels as evidenced by Sport England's Active Lives Children and Young People Survey. This subscription will be paid for each year using the PPSG.
Support Staff/ Sport Coach	£6,000	Funding to hire support staff for clubs.	Over 20 lunch-time and after-school clubs will be supported this year, increasing participation of all children. We will subsidise children to attend sports

			<p>and activity clubs after school and in the holiday. Support staff enable children to try new activities and to help them regulate their emotions and their behaviour.</p> <p>Children get the opportunity to do boxing interventions, to support mental health and wellbeing. Children benefit from having a football coach to play as a team over a lunchtime, which enables the team to learn skills, to play against other school teams.</p>
Swimming	£2,500	To promote swimming and ensure access for all students.	<p>We have allocated £2,500 of our Sports Premium Grant to subsidise swimming provision. Swimming is a statutory element of the PE curriculum and a vital life skill. This contribution ensures that every pupil can participate fully, regardless of background, while parental contributions help maintain sustainability.</p> <p>By using Sports Premium in this way, we remove financial barriers, meet national expectations, and provide pupils with a lifelong skill that directly supports their safety, health and wellbeing. This spend represents less than a quarter of our overall allocation and is a proportionate, high-impact investment.</p>
Equipment	£1,900	Investment in equipment to enhance lesson delivery.	<p>The new equipment will benefit all children, with lunchtime activities anticipated to increase by 45%. Structured games using new footballs and new goals for improved participation and sportsmanship. We would like to buy sashes for the Playground Ambassadors, to enhance their profile. We will allocate time to train the children in the team. This initiative aligns with the DfE's recommendation to enhance sports provision and increase daily physical activity levels among students.</p>
Training and monitoring	£1000	Investment in training a new PE Lead and for new courses	<p>Staff will have the opportunity to attend training to deliver new initiatives and new opportunities to the children. Our Sports Teacher will attend training on new sports, such as cricket and fencing, so that we can offer different types of sport. Our new PE Lead will attend leadership courses.</p>
Fuel for Minibus, for fixtures	£1000	Fuel to take the children to their fixtures and sporting events.	<p>Children will benefit from joining teams and leagues, to play against other schools and teams in the local area.</p>
